Viral Hemorrhagic Fever (VHF) Early Identification and Prevention

Are you prepared for a possible VHF case?

Identify, Isolate, and Inform

1. Identify

Assess Your Patient For:

Exposure:

□ International travel from a country with ongoing VHF transmission/outbreak within the previous 21 days Clinical Screening and Diagnosis for VHFs

OR

Close contact with an individual with a confirmed or suspected Viral Hemorrhagic Fever within the previous 21 days

<u>AND</u>

Signs/Symptoms:

- □ Fever (≥100.4°F or 38.0°C)
- Severe headache
- Muscle/Joint pain
- Chills

- U Weakness
- Fatigue
- Sore throat
- Loss of appetite
- Abdominal pain
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Unexplained hemorrhage (bleeding or bruising)
- Skin Rash
- Red Eyes

2. Isolate

If patient has **both** exposure and symptoms, **isolate the patient immediately**

- Place the patient in private room or separate enclosed area with private bathroom or covered, bedside commode and close the door.
- Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)* accordingly to <u>CDPH guidance.</u>
- Only essential healthcare staff with PPE should evaluate and/or provide care for patient.
- Keep a log of everyone who enters and leaves the patient's room.
- Use disposable medical equipment, if possible, or use dedicated medical equipment.
- Evaluate for other possible diseases.
- Adhere to hand hygiene.
- Follow CDPH guidelines for cleaning, disinfecting, and managing waste[^].

3. Inform

Once you identify and isolate the patient:

 IMMEDIATELY Notify Los Angeles County Department of Public Health at: Business hours: 213-240-7941

After Hours/weekends: 213-974-1234 - ask for the physician on call

• IMMEDIATELY Notify the infection control program and appropriate staff of your health care facility
